Dear church,

By doing this we help to stop long term resentment building up and help to keep our relationship with God and others free from bitterness and pain.

We love to worship together in person and were so excited by the prospect of our outdoor services tomorrow (Sunday 20th) at 3pm and on Christmas Eve at 6.30pm. With cases rising again locally and the news of a more contagious form of the virus being announced, we have decided to move these services online. We do this with a heavy heart, but believe safety needs to come first.

We will still be meeting at 9am in church and 10.30am online tomorrow. Please do join us. The nativity contains many of our children and young people and watching it has brought us such joy in seeing them, as we know it will for you too. Ultimately, it tells the story of hope. Hope that Jesus, a newborn baby, came to save the world.

Whether you are seeing others or not this Christmas, I thank God that the story of hope lives on through Jesus and the retelling of his birth. We are praying God's comfort and joy over you all.
