A phrase I keep hearing at the moment is 'Life will never be the same again.' I think this is true. For those of you who have been to another culture you will be aware of 'reverse culture shock' when you come home. As you re-enter you notice both the positives and negatives of the culture you live in for what they really are. When lock down is lifted, I think for many of us we will suffer from reverse culture shock.

Let me encourage you now to think about what you do and don't like about lockdown. It can be easy to think about what we don't like, but for many of us there will be things we do like too, like chatting to your neighbours or being less busy. We might also be aware of things we have in the past taken for granted like seeing family and we want to be better at doing these in the future.

We see in the Bible, how God is a planner. You can read in Exodus 25 how God gave Moses instructions as to how to build the Ark of the Covenant. The time that Jesus came was meticulously planned so that all the Old Testament prophecies could come true. I believe prayerful planning is important. Can I encourage you to ask God, "How do you want me to live my life once lockdown is over?" "What do you want it to be different?"

We don't know when lockdown will be over, but let's be prayerfully prepared to both put down things and pick up them, as God instructs us.
