





# Update Letter – Tuesday 19th May 2020

Dear all,

I do hope that you are keeping well. Since I last wrote, Boris Johnson has begun to explain his plan for the country to begin easing the lockdown restrictions. This will be a slow journey but, in the meantime, for many of us, life continues in lockdown. We are beginning to think about Church in the months ahead but I'm cautious about setting expectations too early, I suspect we won't be meeting in the building in a normal way for some time yet. So for now, we must keep going as we are, with written and online resources to keep us connected, maintaining regular contact with each other and knowing that this will end eventually and we will be able to be together physically once again.

I want to share a short Bible passage form Luke 6:46-49:

"Why do you call me, 'Lord, Lord,' and do not do what I say? As for everyone who comes to me and hears my words and puts them into practice, I will show you what they are like. They are like a man building a house, who dug down deep and laid the



foundation on rock. When a flood came, the torrent struck that house but could not shake it, because it was well built. But the one who hears my words and does not put them into practice is like a man who built a house on the ground without a foundation. The moment the torrent struck that house, it collapsed and its destruction was complete."

This is in Luke's recounting of the sermon on the mount. Jesus here is speaking to those who have come to hear him, who have been following him but who don't have integrity in that decision. He is calling out their decision to follow him without actually changing the way that they live — putting into practice the words that he speaks. He even suggests that the man might build a very nice house on the sand, he may even live in it quite happily for a time, but because there's no foundations, it will be blown away when the storm comes. I wonder if we need to dig down and re-establish our foundations in Jesus. Are we building on his words or our own? Do we have words of scripture, encounters in prayer, passionate worship as the building blocks in our life? I know at times, I have to check the foundations are strong in my own life — and allow him to shine a light on the cracks or holes that need some attention. I pray for you as Jesus does this for you too.
