Dear all,

2pm National Prayer gathering – on Facebook. I heard Jonathan Oloyede share his heart for this at the New Wine Leaders Conference in March and felt that we should join in. Over 38,000 individuals and churches are signed up. At the 2.00 pm online event, we will be using the word C.H.U.R.C.H as the basis for our prayers. Even if you can't make it online, please allow these prompts to lead your prayers.



C - Covid. Today, in England, lockdown restrictions are easing with hugs and indoor meetings but for many, the pandemic is far from over. We are going to stand in faith for those who are still very much feeling the effects of the virus, including those communities where the Indian variant is on the rise, such as Bolton, Bedford and some parts of London.

H - Healing. The healing we want to pray for exists in many forms, but ultimately we are asking for God to bring His healing and peace which goes beyond all human understanding.

U - Unity. Pentecost was about the disciples being together #InOneAccord. We pray for the unity of the church at the national, regional, and local level. How might God use His church in this nation and in our communities more when we unite?

R - Repentance. What does the church need to come and repent of as we move forward? In one of our recent 7.00pm prayer meetings, Paul Harcourt, the National Leader of New Wine England spoke about the sin of racism.

C - Communities. During the early stages of the pandemic, 74% of people said they knew and were actively serving their neighbour. We are going to pray that we would not stop being those Ambassadors of Hope in our communities, asking for God's guidance as we continue to see what is going on around us.

H - Holy Spirit revival. We are going to ask God to fall afresh on us as individuals but also as a church so that we can be sent out to GO!
