

Thursday 7th January 2021

Dear church family,

I write to you as we yet again face a national lockdown, not something any of us wanted. In some ways it feels like another kick in the teeth. We have taken the difficult decision to close our building for the time being for both services and private prayer – but this decision will be under review over the coming weeks. We're heartbroken but feel that this is the sensible thing to do to ensure everyone's safety and protection. We'll let you know as soon as we have more positive news on this front.

I read a quote this morning which said "We are not all in the same boat but we are in the same storm". We are all facing the storm of lockdown 3 but are each in a different boat, some are in yachts and some are on driftwood. Please be kind to yourself as you realise the impact of this lockdown on you.



The Bible is really clear about comparison, it's not a good thing. It's not good to be jealous when others have what we want, this is the 10th commandment. But I also don't think comparison about others having a tougher time than us is helpful either. Whether you are on a yacht or on driftwood or somewhere in between, it's important that we all acknowledge the storm. If you feel you are on driftwood, please be in touch and we will try and help in whatever way we can. The Bible is really clear, life it not about us – it's about Jesus.

Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. For the joy set before him he endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. Consider him who endured such opposition from sinners, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart.

Hebrews 12: 1-3

For me this passage brings me such hope at present. My life is about Jesus, this is my priority. Jesus should be my first port of call for everything. It is Jesus that I take my concerns and pain to. It is Jesus who I look to as my source of hope. It is Jesus who helps me *'not grow weary and lose heart.'* This is our prayer for you too as we face another lockdown with very little emotional capacity, that you would *'Consider him who endured such opposition from sinners, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart.'*

So as we start 2021, let's be a community who try to fix our eyes on Jesus. There are a number of things that can really help us all do that:

Read the Bible and Pray

In an update email James sent earlier this week, he included some daily resources to help you get started and we're also attaching daily readings until the end of February to this letter. I encourage you give it a go.



Watch Sunday Services and join in with Zoom coffee

It can be so easy to get digital fatigue and switch off from watching services online. We know they are nothing in comparison to actually all being together, but they are the best we have at present and really do help. For those who can, commenting along helps us feel connected and encouraged.


Join a Growth Group

A great way to help us fix our eyes on Jesus and not grow weary and lose heart is to be part of a Growth Group.
